Background

The Mobility Officer (MO) Program was approved by the Vice Chief of Staff of the Army in July 1997. Initially the intent was to replace Transportation Corps lieutenants with MOs, but the plan was modified to have the MOs assigned to the divisions and Stryker Brigades. The purpose was to have these knowledgeable technicians embedded in the combat units to plan and execute deployment and distribution operations. They have already demonstrated their value during the deployments and in-theater transportation operations in conjunction with OEF/OIF. The program has recently experienced a significant growth in Mobility Officer authorizations with the Army's transition into brigade combat teams, and is open to qualified applicants from the Army and other Services.



What is a Mobility Officer?

A Mobility Officer is a skilled technician who:

- Advises the commander on the joint deployment process
- Plans, coordinates, and executes deployments and redeployments
- Develops and conducts training associated with unit movement operations
- Identifies and remedies deployment issues
- Provides expert distribution advice to facilitate sustainment operations
- Assists commanders in planning and conducting operational maneuver

Minimum Prerequisites (Waivers will not be granted)

- Must be an E4 (P) or above
- Must have at least two years of documented experience in executing movement control and/or deployment operations
- Must have a current Secret Security Clearance (Interims are unacceptable)

Preferred Qualifications

- Graduate of Unit Movement Officer Deployment Planning Course
- Associate Degree from an accredited college or university
