
USATCFE Environmental Policy

Recycling and Solid Waste Management

Solid waste and recyclable waste is collected weekly from the installation and housing areas. The items that can be recycled include: paper and paper products, glass, plastic, cardboard and cardboard products. Military and civilian personnel should have solid waste receptacles and recycling bins available at their area of employment.

At Fort Eustis, the Solid Waste, Recycling, and Pollution Prevention Center (SWRPPC) is in Bldg 1209 on Taylor Blvd. This facility accepts solid waste, recyclable materials and yard wastes, Tel. 878-4232. At Fort Story, certain items can also be accepted at the Recycling Yard on Hospital Rd., Bldg 1053, Tel. 422-7634.

Household Chemical Exchange Program

The SWRPPC, Bldg 1209, maintains a chemical exchange program where Fort Eustis family housing residents can drop off or pick up unused household chemicals - for free!

Affirmative Procurement

Purchasing products that are made from recycled content "closes the loop" for recycled products. As well, it reduces waste disposal and conserves natural resources for future generations. It is the policy of Fort Eustis and Fort Story to purchase items with the highest recycled content practicable. A list of these items can be found in the Comprehensive Procurement Guidelines published by the Environmental Protection Agency. Restoration

Restoration involves identifying, investigating, cleaning up contaminated sites from past practices and restoring the site for future use.

Natural and Cultural Conservation

The installation ensures that personnel comply with all federal and state laws that pertain to natural resources, including flora and fauna, and cultural resources, including historic site preservation. Personnel and residents doing work that might impact nests, migratory birds, threatened or endangered species, archeological sites, or other resources should contact ENRD.

Asbestos and Lead-Based Paints

If you have a concern regarding asbestos or lead-based paints, please contact ENRD for assistance. Many, but not all housing and administrative areas have undergone abatement.

The U.S. Army Transportation Center Fort Eustis (USATCFE) is pleased to provide this information to those just entering the mission, civilian or residential roles here at Fort Eustis and Fort Story. The USATCFE has adopted policies that give a high priority to environmental stewardship.

Our principal goal is to maintain an installation that takes a proactive approach to ensure long-term viability of the mission by reducing environmental impacts and managing resources so they will be available for future use.

The Environmental Program is managed by the Environmental and Natural Resources Division (ENRD) of the Directorate of Public Works. Please use this brochure to become familiar with sustainable environmental management at Fort Eustis.

Hazardous Materials Procurement

Hazardous materials MUST be purchased through the Fort Eustis HazMart or the Little Creek Naval Base Hazmin Center, which services Fort Story. This policy does not apply to hazardous materials to be used for personal in-home use. It does apply for government uses such as in the motor pool or for industrial applications. The Fort Eustis HazMart is located on Taylor Ave in Bldg 1205, Tel. 878-2781. The Fort Story Hazmin Center is located on NAB Little Creek, Bldg 2117, Tel. 462-4025.

Hazardous Waste Disposal, Storage, and Management

Personnel who use hazardous materials may also generate hazardous wastes. Personnel generating hazardous wastes must contact the Fort Eustis Hazardous Waste Accumulation Facility (HWAFF), Bldg 1208 on Taylor Ave.,

Tel. 878-3915. The Fort Story HWAFF is located in Bldg 1011, on Hospital Rd., Tel. 422-7404.

Stormwater Management

Army Regulations prohibit the discharge of anything into storm drains other than stormwater runoffs. Some examples of prohibited items are motor oil and cooking grease. Family housing residents cannot change the motor oil in their cars at housing areas. Cooking grease should be frozen, double-bagged and placed in the trash.

Spill Reporting

All discharges of oil or any hazardous material (into a water source such as storm drains, drainage ditches,

streams, lakes, ponds, rivers, etc or onto the ground) of any quantity must be reported immediately by calling Fire & Emergency Services, **Dial 911**.

Take all appropriate measures to prevent discharges. Avoid discharging paint, oil, solvents and other hazardous materials from washing off tools, vehicles or equipment into water sources.

Drinking Water

The Drinking Water Program ensures the quality of potable water by sampling, testing, and flushing of lines to meet state safe drinking water regulations.


