SUBJECT: Command Safety Policy

1. As the Army continues its role in the Global War on Terror, the demand for professional and competent leaders has grown significantly. Our primary mission, to safely train the Transportation Corps' Soldiers and civilians, has become more demanding, rigorous, and realistic. These changes require everyone to become well versed in the application of Composite Risk Management in executing such an important role. The safe conduct of military operations and training involves exposure to hazards while managing the associated risk identified through detailed risk assessments. The residual risk identified by these assessments will only be accepted by those designated in my Risk Acceptance Policy.
2. The Army's leadership has designated Composite Risk Management as our principle means of force protection. With this in mind, we must ensure every leader has the ability to demonstrate proficiency in its full application. This will be done through a realistic education and training program that equips every leader and cadre with the necessary skills needed to train to standard while simultaneously protecting our valuable resources.
3. Commanders will implement a Safety and Occupational Health Program that ensures every assigned person is afforded living and working conditions free of hazards and provides a productive working environment. Your program will address the essential elements of safety that promotes awareness of on and off duty safety, with special emphasis on privately owned vehicle and motorcycle safety.
4. We must establish an environment that demands performance to standard, wise decisions on risk management, implementation of risk mitigation measures, and care for our Soldiers.
